"The Introduction to Social Dance DVD contains 7 introductory rhythms on 1 DVD - cha cha, rumba, jive, slow two step, waltz, foxtrot and tango. It only includes 6 or so figures in each rhythm and several routines built from those figures. It is intended to introduce dancers to Social Dance as a recruitment tool for round dancing and so includes techniques and leading and following tips for teachers and dancers.

It does not include all round dance rhythms such as Bolero, Samba, Paso Doble etc. It is not intended to replace the complete program of introductory rhythms found on the RAL DVD. If you want all introductory figures and rhythms, the RAL DVD's would be your best option. Cheers." Ann Clements.

Colorado Springs Spectacular

This 4-6 festival is held over Labor Day Weekend in the beautiful mountains of Colorado. Grace and Milo Ferry host the festival and George and Pam Hurd are the clinicians. Colorado Springs is a wonderful place to visit in the early fall – Crispy mornings and evenings and wonderful sun shiny days. The leaves on the aspens up in the mountains are just barely beginning to turn.

If you want to add sightseeing to your trip as we did on our way to the festival, there is plenty to see and do in Colorado. We splurged for an all day train ride on the Cumbres and Toltec Narrow Gauge Railroad which runs from Antonito to Chama. This steam train crosses the New Mexico/Colorado border 11 times during the morning and afternoon trip with a delightful country lunch in Ozier. The train yards and depots are open for you to freely wander about in both Chama and Antonito, although the Chama side has much more to see. Steam is blown out over the two trestles during the ride to clean the water box of sediment, and it is quite impressive.

The festival itself started Friday evening with George and Milo cuing. Saturday we “fought the bull” to Fiesta Madrilena (Phase 6, Paso Doble, Hurd) and then in the afternoon changed pace for a Bolero, On My Journey (Phase 5+, Shibata). George and Pam even added a quickie teach in the afternoon of I Got A Girl (Phase 4, Mambo, Preskitt). After the dance on Saturday night, Milo and Grace opened their home for wine and fellowship. Oh, and watch out for animals as you head back to your cars. Milo and Grace are in the foothills just a short drive from the dance hall, but some critters make there way down in the evening.

Sunday after the review, Grace took those of us interested in shoe shopping to Assemble Dancewear. This shop is the best ballroom shoe shop that I have been in. Allow 1-2 hours for proper shoe fitting by their experienced staff. I can’t tell you how many shoes I tried on, but the selection was phenomenal – and I came home with – do I dare say it – five pairs. And, yes, JL came home with a pair too, just one however. This is a must side trip if you are ever in the Colorado Springs area, – or even better – plan a dancing trip for the Colorado Springs Spectacular with a stopover for shoes.

Great floor, great dancing, great hosts, great clinicians, -- and great shopping. What else can you ask for?
