Theron originates from Tennessee and Christine from England. They met at a singles square dance in Texas in 1980 and were married in 1985. They graduated from Ed Campbell's round dance lessons in 1982 and continued to dance with Ed until his retirement in 1991. They also danced with Charlie and Bettye Procter and were members of the Dallas Let's Dancers Exhibition Group for three years, during which time they did demos at many square and round dance events, including Nortex Roundup, State, and Nationals. They served as Directors for Programmed Rounds for the National Convention held in San Antonio in 1996.

They taught their first dance (A Beautiful Noise) on Memorial Day in 1989, and then began cueing and teaching regularly in August that same year. They have been on staff for week-long functions at Fun Valley, Red River, and Kirkwood, and also have been featured instructors at numerous weekend festivals at local, state and national levels. They presently cue for Ramblin' Rounds round dance club (Tuesdays phases 3-4+;

Wednesdays phases 4-6), and three square dance clubs: Lone Star Solos, Rebel Rousers, and Steeple Steppers.

They are members of Roundalab (serving on Phase 5 ROQ Committee), Universal Round Dance Council (AURDC@), Texas Round Dance Teachers Association (ATRDTC@), Dixie Round Dance Council (ADRDC@), and North Texas Callers Association (ANTCA@). They have been actively involved in the Harvest Holiday Festival since 1983, and currently serve as Festival Co-Chair.

They have choreographed several dances, including Hold on Partner, Tanageray, Hey You There in the Mirror, Better Days, Let's Go Spend Your Money Honey, Mi Vida Loca (My Crazy Life), Adelida and Rebel Rouser.

Theron is retired, and Christine works at a major downtown Dallas law firm.
