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### Message from the Chairman

We pulled it off again. Harvest Holiday 2006 was a big success, thanks to the hard work of many HH members, the local and out-of-town cuers, and, of course, the 2006 Chairmen Christine and Theron Hixson. We also extend special thanks to Donna and Jack Jones who are retiring from active cueing for their support of Harvest Holiday over the years.

Now the really hard work begins. HH must make some decisions about the future of the festival and its other activities. We are forming a Planning Committee that will consider **all available options**. We welcome your participation on this committee. Change is never easy, but many believe that some changes are needed.

A "Transition" business meeting is scheduled for Sunday, February 11, 2007 at 1:00 **sharp**. Be sure to attend and voice your opinion. In addition, the Planning Committee will begin its work in February. However, if we want to make changes for the 2007 Festival, we need to make some decisions **very soon**.

First, the facts:

1. With four nights of Trail-in dances, three days of Impromptu teaches and the actual weekend festival, HH is hosting a **seven-day festival**, including parties every night.
2. The Sterling Hotel is raising the ballroom rental fee to \$5000 and eliminating most of the complimentary hotel rooms, including the Chairman's Suite, which will be \$250/night next year.
3. Donna and Jack Jones are retiring, so we will have one less local cuer at the festival, Fun Dances and other events.

4. A **small** group of **dedicated** members host the festival and the other activities. Many have been doing the same job for several years and are tired.

Issues for decision:

1. Continue to host a seven-day festival, or scale back to a weekend festival or something in between?
2. Stay at the Sterling Hotel or move elsewhere?
3. Continue to have the festival the week of Thanksgiving or change to one week earlier or one week later?
4. Other changes in the format of the festival to lower both our expenses and workload?

There are many factors to consider when making these decisions. We want each of you to begin thinking about what is best for the future of Harvest Holiday. Finally, we wish each of you a happy holiday season and good health and happiness in 2007.

## Education Spot

Harold & Meredith Sears of Boulder, Colorado have given our Harvest Holiday Newsletter permission to print a quotation from their very useful web site. To see the site, go to [www.rounddancing.net/dance](http://www.rounddancing.net/dance). This month get your valentine in an excellent dance frame. Here's how:

A key to smooth lead and follow is a stable dance frame. This frame involves tone in the muscles of the upper body; not tension, certainly not stiffness, but enough tone so that the man can communicate to the woman, and the woman can sense or feel that communication.

The man is upright and even a bit arched back. Never lean over your partner. The woman is pressed firmly into the man's right arm. Perhaps the most conspicuous feature of the dance frame is the more-or-less horizontal oval described by the shoulders and arms of both dancers. Lead hands (man's left and woman's right) are held a little above shoulder level. The man's right hand is cupped against the woman's back, just under her left shoulder blade, fingers together and angled downward. The woman's left hand is perched lightly on the man's right shoulder or upper arm.

Hips are in contact. The woman's right hip bone is "in the man's watch pocket." We communicate with knees and thighs, too. He will lower a little before each figure, and so his knee will contact the lady's leg, telling her we are about to move. He might signal a turning figure with a little upper body rotation. A toned frame communicates between hands, arms, hips, and thighs.
