We are fortunate to be beginning another year. Our activity lost a few clubs and festivals around the country for several reasons. Facilities to host events are becoming too expensive and our lovely wood floors are disappearing. Many challenges to be met for each dance to be accomplished!

The life force of our activity is all the "unsung heroes" that make it possible for us to enjoy our activity for a couple of hours, a weekend or even an entire week at a time.

Unsung Hero = " a person who makes a substantive yet unrecognized contribution"

There would be nothing we could afford to attend regularly without the time and efforts of the many Unsung Heroes supporting our activity around the world. Every time we walk into a facility and sit down to put on our dancing shoes, people have given of their time to come early and set up everything the dancers will need as well preparing the area for the cuers' equipment, sign-in tables, future event notices, food, snack and/or drink areas. During a dance or festival, our unsung heroes give up floor time as needed to take care of their guests - even though they love dancing as much or more than we do!
